PIBO is committed to safeguarding both people and wildlife and will continue to take necessary precautions to address this serious outbreak.

#### **Protecting Urban Birds: Take Action Against Pesticide Poisoning**

As a key partner in the Bird Friendly Windsor initiative—certified by Nature Canada in 2022—PIBO remains committed to reducing threats to urban birds. One major concern is pesticide poisoning, particularly the accumulation of rodenticides in hawks and owls that ingest poisoned rodents.

A new federal petition calls for a review of Canada's pesticide regulatory process and an independent assessment of its impact on wildlife. Pesticide poisoning poses a serious risk to birds and other animals—please consider signing and sharing the petition **before March 23.**

Additionally, learn how <u>University of Western</u> students are helping to reduce rodenticide use by replacing traditional rodent traps with Eastern Screech Owl nesting boxes—an eco-friendly solution that protects both pets and wildlife.
